



# Join the Health Board!

## Who can apply?

These are the requirements for the two open Health Board positions, as set by state law:

### Consumers of Public Health position

- Kitsap County resident
- Self-identifies as having faced significant health inequities; or
- Has lived experience with a public health-related program (such as SNAP, WIC, home visiting nurse, or treatment).

RCW 70.46.031 strongly encourages that people from historically marginalized/underrepresented communities are given preference.

### Other Community Stakeholders position

Applicants must represent one of the following groups located in Kitsap County:

- Organizations that work with people experiencing health inequities
- Military service members and veterans
- The business community
- The environmental public health-regulated community (sectors such as food service, onsite sewage, and drinking water).

## What does the Kitsap Public Health Board do?

The Kitsap Public Health Board enforces state and local public health regulations and oversees the work of the Kitsap Public Health District. The Health District's mission is to prevent disease and protect and promote the health of all people in Kitsap County.

The Health Board typically meets on the first Tuesday of each month in downtown Bremerton. Nonelected Board members can receive a stipend for attending meetings.
