RV Waste Disposal Requirements



Wastewater from a recreational vehicle's showers, sinks, and toilets may contain fecal matter, dirt, food particles, oil and grease. **It may also contain harmful bacteria or viruses, called pathogens, that can make people sick.**

Pathogens found in RV waste can cause diarrhea, vomiting, skin infections, earaches, sore throats, colds, and flu. Some of these pathogens end up going down the drain.

Because RV wastewater can make people sick, it must be handled and disposed of properly. Both greywater (from sinks and showers) and blackwater (from toilets) are considered sewage. Discharging sewage to the ground surface, surface water, groundwater, cesspools, or unpermitted sewage systems is **not allowed** in Washington state.
